

“Do I have a valid photo ID for voting?”

- Do you have a current or expired Tennessee driver’s license?

If it has a photo, you have a valid form of photo ID

If you have no driver’s license:

- Do you have a Tennessee handgun carry permit with your photo?

If yes, you have a valid form of photo ID

- Do you have any other form of photo ID issued by the state of Tennessee?
(e.g., Tennessee state employee ID, public university faculty/staff ID, but remember, college student IDs are not acceptable)

If yes, you have a valid form of photo ID

- Do you have a photo ID issued by any other state?

If yes, you have a valid form of photo ID

- Do you have a current or expired U.S. Passport?

If yes, you have a valid form of photo ID

- Do you have a U.S. Military ID with your photo?
(e.g. Common Access Card, Veteran Identification Card, U.S. Uniformed Services Card)

If yes, you have a valid form of photo ID

- Do you have any other form of photo ID issued by the federal government?
(e.g., Federal government employee ID or subcontractor ID if issued by the federal government, U.S. Passport Card, various form of ID issued by TSA)

If yes, you have a valid form of photo ID

If you have none of the forms of photo ID listed above:

- You may obtain free photo ID for voting at the nearest Department of Safety and Homeland Security driver service center. To obtain a free photo ID, you will need:
 - Proof of citizenship (such as a birth certificate), and
 - Two proofs of Tennessee residency (such as your voter registration card, a utility bill, vehicle registration/title, or bank statement).
 - NOTE: If your name differs from that on your primary ID, you will need to show proof of the name change (such as certified marriage certificate, divorce decree, or certified court order).
- If you have a non-photo driver’s license, the Department of Safety and Homeland Security or participating county clerks’ offices will add your photo to you license free of charge.
