Tennessee P.O.S.T. Transition School

Instructors: TLETA

Counselor: Owens

This course is designed to train law enforcement officers hired from another state, or in-state officers who have had a break in service of more than five (5) years but less than ten (10) years, or officers who attended an approved basic law enforcement school and has been hired after two (2) years of the completion of that training. **This Transition School is mandated by POST Rule 1110-02-.01 in place of challenging the POST test.** This training is required within six (6) months of hire date. Officers will be required to be in uniform each day and bring duty belt, duty weapon, tennis shoes, shorts, t-shirt, sweats and groin protection. The school will be held at the Tennessee Law Enforcement Training Academy. Officers are to report to the Academy each Sunday and will be released on Thursday each week. Law Enforcement Dealing with People with Mental Health and Disabilities

(TLETA)

This course will assist Patrol Officers and Jail Intake Officers that work with people with mental health and disabilities in a law enforcement setting. Students will be subjected to terminology related to mental illness, methods of suicide, ways to interact with individuals with disabilities, communication with individuals with mental illness, communication with individuals with disabilities, understanding of the juvenile and adult process for evaluation, the different types of medications and to assist Law Enforcement Officers with mental illness. Child sex crimes as mandated by P.O.S.T. will also be taught in this class. The class hours are from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday and Tuesday.

Any PPCT Instructor whose certification has expired must repeat the 40-hour PPCT Defensive Tactics Instructor School and will not be eligible to attend this course. **Course cost includes a copy of the most current PPCT Instructor Manual.** **NOTE: This will be the only Re-Certification class offered for the 2012 calendar year.**

Advanced Motorcycle Officer and Tactical Shooting

Instructor: Owens

Class will start on Monday at 8:00 a.m. and end on Thursday evening. There will be classes at night during the week. All participants must be prepared for after dark riding and night fire exercises. This training is designed for experienced motorcycle officers previously certified on a recognized police motor officer course.

Officers will be introduced to Tactical situations involving their motors, day and night shooting situations, known and unknown risk traffic stops, escort procedures, emergency cover situations, advanced riding techniques, and advanced cone patterns. Simunitions will be utilized in this training to produce as close to life-like situations as possible.

OFFICERS ATTENDING THIS TRAINING WILL NEED: All gear worn on duty when on the motorcycle, including gun belt with duty holster, duty weapon, vest, duty motorcycle, rain gear, DOT helmet (quick release chin strap recommended), safety glasses, long sleeve shirt or jacket, full-fingered gloves, long pants, over the ankle boots, and three hundred (300) rounds of ammunition.

Extra sweatshirts, vest and extra pants are recommended for Simunitions and range portions. Officers attending this training should be prepared for a week of intense training with their motorcycle.

Emergency Vehicle Operations Instructor

This 40-hour program will address the issues of Emergency Vehicle Operations in law enforcement. Each officer attending will be required to pass the written exam and pass the precision EVO course in a specified time.

Force on Force Instructor School

This 24-hour course of instruction is designed to instruct current trainers in the skills necessary to institute Reality Based Training programs within their individual departments. Subjects taught will include: Psychological Aspects of Deadly Force Encounters; Safety Requirements for Reality Based Training; Scenario Development (to include: Scenario Design, Role Player Preparation, Site Considerations and Logistical Requirements); and the Necessity of After-Action Review and Remediation Protocol. Because this class is designed to instruct trainers, it is necessary to restrict participation to Firearms Instructors and/or Defensive Tactics Instructors.

Firearms Instructor

This is an intensive performance-oriented course. Officers must bring their own ammunition for this course. It will consist of the following: 1000 rounds of handgun ammunition, 75 rounds for 12-gauge shotgun birdshot (#7, #8, or #9). Officers should bring a carbine (preferably an M-4 or similar weapon and 400 rounds of ammunition for that weapon. Officers must fire 90% with both pistol and shotgun to successfully complete the program. Officers are to bring a flashlight, safety glasses, and a bullet resistant vest. Although not mandatory, it is preferred that the officer bring a laptop to this class. It is mandatory that officers have their Instructor Development training before enrolling in this school. A copy of the Instructor Development certificate will need to accompany the "Application for Specialized Training" form when registering with T.L.E.T.A.

Law Enforcement Management and Administration (Athens PD)

The Law Enforcement Management and Administration class will provide police managers with the tools to effectively manage the various legal mandates of the state and federal governments. Most police managers rise through the ranks to become chiefs or command officers. In many cases, chiefs and command officers are ill prepared to deal with all the administrative requirements of the job. Many become aware of legal mandates after they get in trouble. This class is designed to provide chiefs and command officers with the knowledge and ability to deal with these duties in an effective and proactive manner. A block of CSA and EVOC will be included. This class will begin at 1300 hours on Monday, April 16th and ends at noon on Friday, April 20th.

The class should be considered a **must** for newly appointed chiefs, persons in line to be in a chief's position, and command staff officers. PPCT Spontaneous Knife Defensive Instructor

Instructor: Wills

The PPCT Spontaneous Knife Defensive system is designed to provide the officer with a means to successfully defend themselves against an edged weapon assault during an encounter where the use of deadly force is not practical or perhaps not available. This program when completed will give the officer/student the skills necessary to deflect, control, or disengage from an edged weapon attack.

Program topics will include: Limitations and Capabilities of the Edged Weapon, Principals of Edged Weapon Assaults, Fundamentals of Knife Martial Arts and the Knife Defensive Systems.

Each student must attend the program in its entirety, along with passing both a comprehensive written and physical skills exam. Successful completion will enable the new instructor to return to their respective department and instruct the Knife Defense system at the Basic/User level and officer certification. Students will need to be physically prepared for a challenging three days as this program mandates an abundance of physical skills practice.

Special Equipment Required: All students must bring shin guards, groin protection, and belt with handcuff case. Students will not be allowed to participate without proper equipment.

Course Prerequisites: All applicants must have at least five (5) years of full-time law enforcement or corrections experience, and have completed a POST or T.C.I. approved Instructor Development School prior to attending. (Proof of Instructor Development must accompany the specialized school application). *Course cost includes a PPCT Manual.*

Duty belts with holster are required. Upon successful completion of this program, the officer will be certified to teach the PPCT Defensive Tactics system at the **Basic/User** level and offer certification. Child Sex Abuse **will not** be offered with this program. **Tuition includes cost of PPCT Manual.**

This 16-hour school is for the criminal investigator who wishes to expand his/her techniques in the field of interview and interrogation. Each student will learn to analyze written statements for signs of veracity and deception. This is a hands-on class which will require homework assignments. The following areas of statement analysis will be covered:

- History and Theory
- Documentation of Statements
- Balance of a Statement
- Test of Veracity
- Analysis of Nouns
- Analysis of Pronouns
- Analysis of Adjectives
- Analysis of Adverbs
- Analysis of Verbs
- Unique Words and Phrases

Low-Light Operators Course

This 16-hour course is designed to instruct students how to operate in a tactical environment under low light conditions. This is not a SWAT school. This school is intended for the patrol officer performing patrol functions. Subjects covered will include: Proper deployment of light in low-light/no-light conditions, techniques for the use of a light in a tactical environment (room clearing, building searching), proper low-light flashlight techniques and shooting in a low-light environment. Officers should bring at least 1 high intensity handheld flashlight (preferably with rear switch activation), 250 rounds of duty ammo, eye and ear protection, athletic cup, gun belt (as worn on duty) and clothing suitable for projectile-based training. Basic S.W.A.T.

This 60-hour course is designed to instruct newly appointed S.W.A.T. operators in the skills necessary to successfully merge into their assigned teams. This is a physically demanding school with long hours. Officers should come prepared both physically and mentally to perform task essential exercises. Officers should bring with them 1000 rounds of handgun ammo and 500 rounds of sub-gun/carbine ammo. Anyone not able to qualify with a 90% on the handgun qualification will be sent home without refund. Registration is through TLETA.
