NASHVILLE –Tennessee’s November unemployment rate of 4.1 percent, up four-tenths of a percentage point over October, was released on December 21. County unemployment rates released today showed that 87 county rates were up, five county rates were down, and three remained the same over the month.

Williamson County at 2.1 percent, up from 2.0 percent, registered the state’s lowest county unemployment rate. Carroll County at 14.0 percent, up from 10.2 percent, reported the state’s highest jobless rate.

Knox County at 2.2 percent in November, up from 2.1 percent, registered the lowest metropolitan county unemployment rate. Hamilton County registered at 2.8 percent, up from 2.6 percent. Davidson County reported a 2.9 percent rate, up from 2.8 percent, while Shelby County reported a 4.0 percent rate, up from 3.8 percent.
