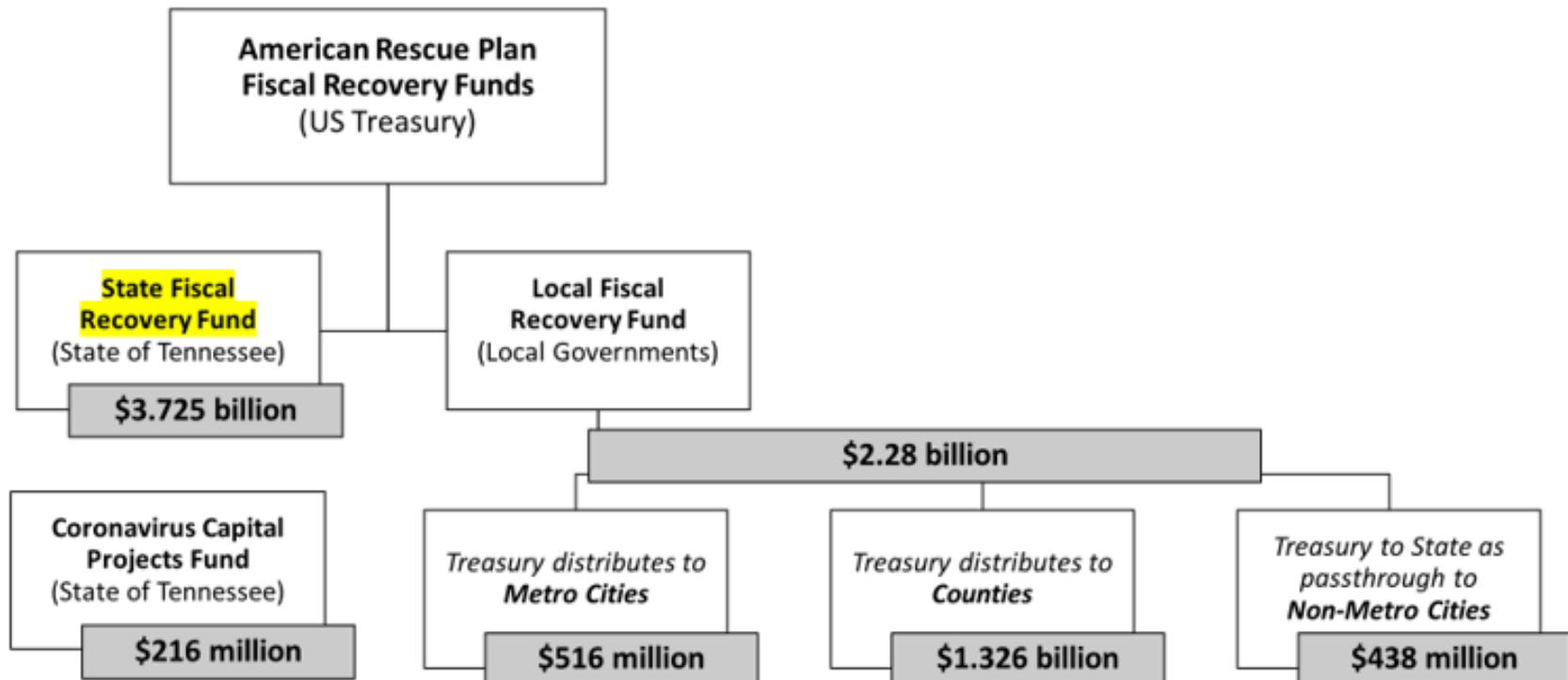
American Rescue Plan (ARP) State and Local Funding for TN

Local Fiscal Recovery Funds:

- Deposited directly to local governments from U.S. Treasury or the State of Tennessee
- Does not require match/co-funding
- Requires justification of spending
- May be used on any eligible activity as defined by U.S. Treasury's Final Rule

State Fiscal Recovery Funds (TDEC ARP):

- Requires application to TDEC with project details to access funds
- Requires match/co-funding (15-35% with available incentives)
- May only be used on drinking water, wastewater or stormwater projects

BIL Implementation Goals

- Provide flexibility for states to meet local water needs.
- Target resources to disadvantaged communities.
 - Prioritizes funding to underserved communities
- Make rapid progress on lead-free water for all.
 - \$15B dedicated to lead service line removal and compliance assistance with LCRR
- Tackle forever chemicals.
 - \$10B to provide relief to address emerging contaminants, with a focus on PFOA and PFAS

Building a Pipeline of Projects

- Provide technical assistance and tools to support technical, managerial, and financial capacities and ensure compliance
 - TN Infrastructure Scorecard
 - Asset Management Plan Template
 - Business Action Plans
- Streamline processes and incentivize planning and design projects that lead to construction
 - Pre-development and pre-construction funding to seed project development for small and disadvantaged communities
- Encourage and incentivize regional approaches

SFY23 – State BIL Funding - \$161.7M

- Overflow Stormwater Grants (OSG)
 - Annual and recurring
- Water Infrastructure Investments for the Nation (WIIN)
 - Annual and recurring
- BIL grants and loans with substantial loan forgiveness
 - CWSRF Supplemental – 49% to be provided as grants/fully forgivable loans to small and disadvantaged communities
 - CWSRF Emerging Contaminants – 100% grants/fully forgivable loans
 - DWSRF Supplemental – 49% to be provided as grants/fully forgivable loans to small and disadvantaged communities
 - DWSRF Emerging Contaminants – 100% grants/fully forgivable loans
 - DWSRF Lead Service Line Replacement – 49% to be provided as grants/fully forgivable loans to small and disadvantaged communities

SRF Funding Process & Timeline

1. Solicitation for Clean Water and Drinking Water Projects (open in February/March close)
2. Project Scoring (March/April)
3. Develop/Finalize of Priority Ranking Lists (June)
4. Intended Use Plans (IUP) Meeting (July)
5. Apply for Federal capitalization grants (August)
6. Notify those on PRLs (August/September)
7. Second Drinking Water Project solicitation (August)
8. Notice of award (September/October)
9. Proceed to loan request process
