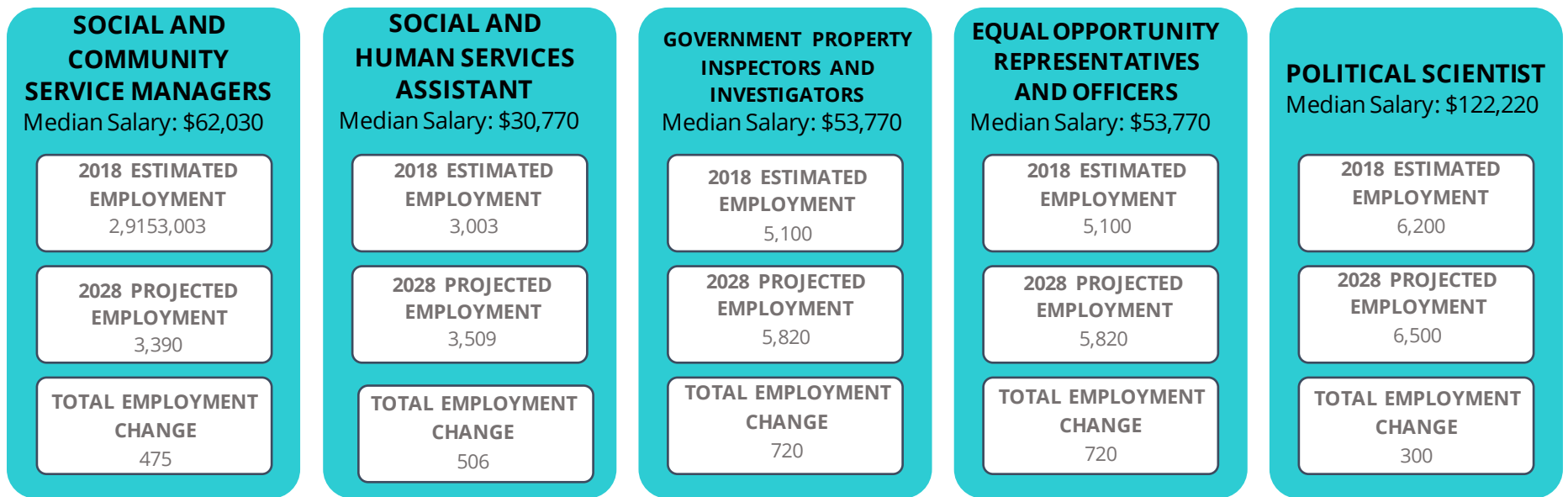
JOB OUTLOOK

An increasing population, along with state and local assumption of responsibility for some services previously provided by the federal government, is fueling the growth in the public management and administration sector. State and local government employment is projected to increase approximately 12 percent during the next decade. Employment growth will stem from a rising demand for services at the state and local levels.



OCCUPATION PROFILE

Government and Public Administration careers encompass a variety of careers from most of the sixteen national career clusters. These five careers are an integral part of government business. Equal Opportunity Representatives assess equal opportunity law compliance. Community Service Managers plan and coordinate social service programs. Social Service Assistants support social work operations. Property inspectors ensure government property regulation compliance. Political Scientists study the operation of political systems.

JOB OUTLOOK

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics' Standard Occupational Classification System, job opportunities within the Department of Defense should be strong for qualified individuals in all branches of the armed forces through 2028. All services have entry-level and professional position needs to fill as current members of the armed forces move up through the ranks, leave the service, or retire. Specific employment data for military careers is confidential.



OCCUPATION PROFILE

Careers in the military reflect those in civilian life giving enlisted personnel a wide variety of career choices. These five careers are an integral part of the military as they support and protect troops. Communications specialists and signal corps officers operate and maintain communication systems. Helicopter pilots use helicopters to transport personnel, equipment, and supplies. Military police investigators are law enforcement professionals within military forces.
